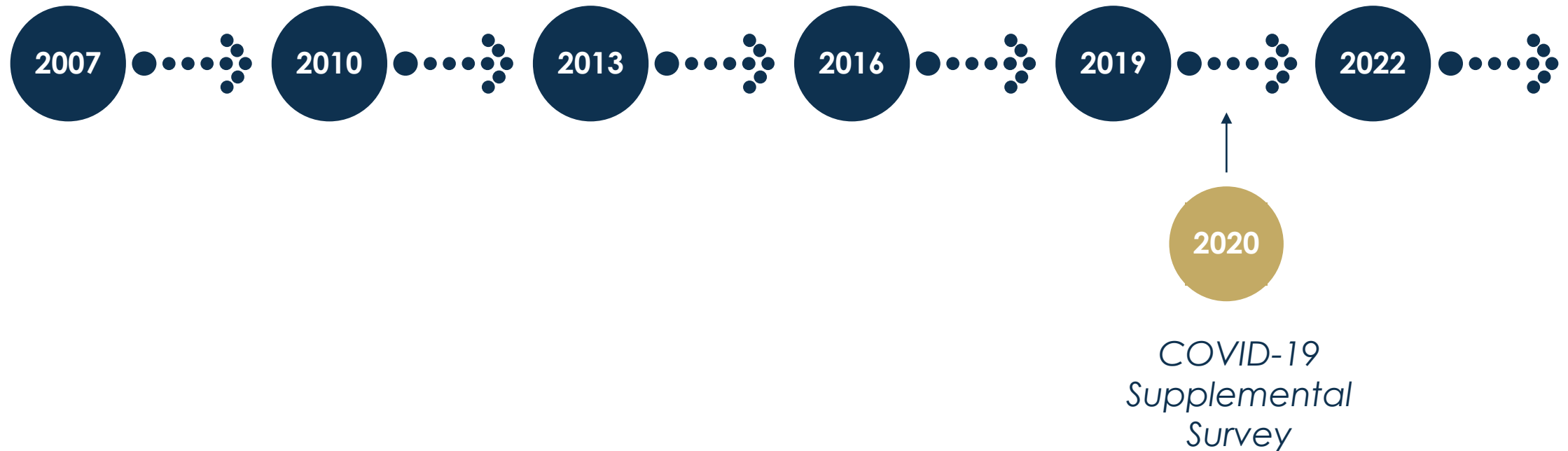
Survey Overview & Methods

What is a Community Health Assessment (CHA)?



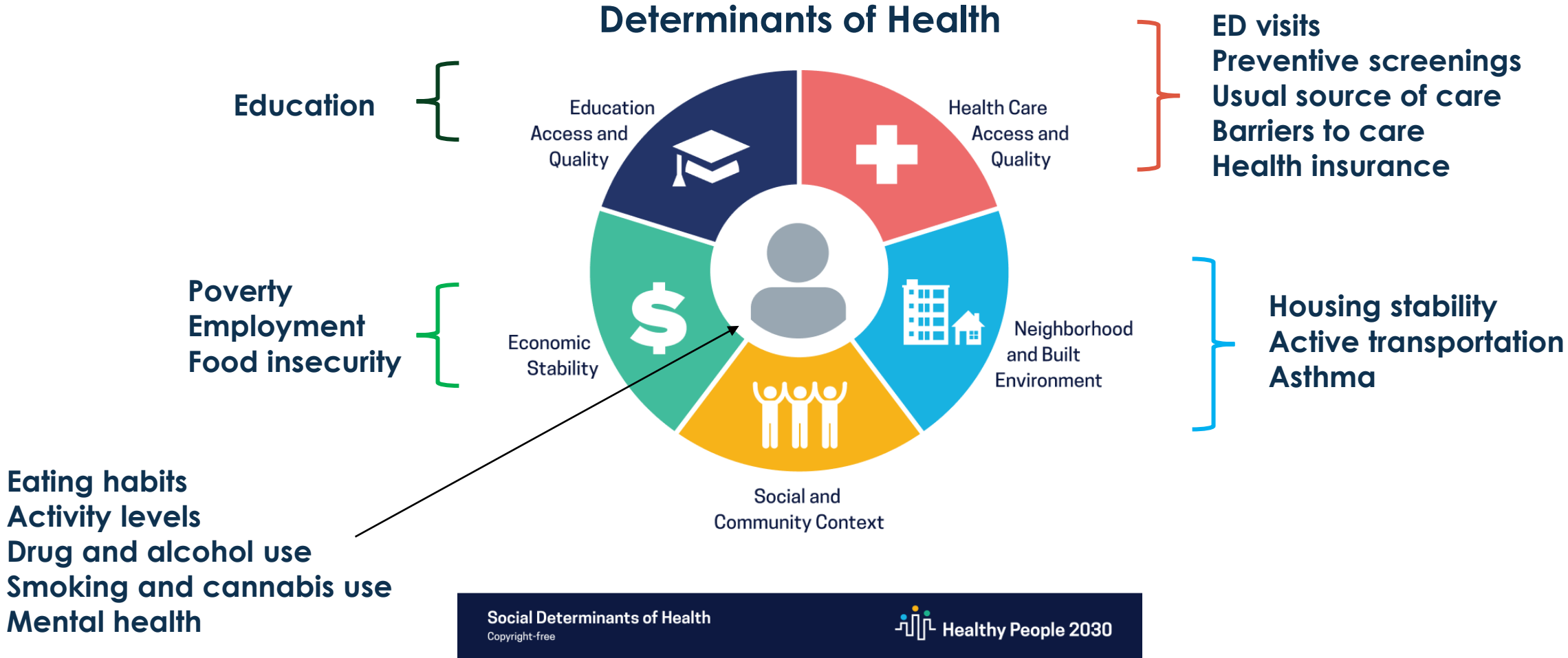
- Provides **foundation** to improve the health of a population
- Tells the **community story**
- Identifies **health disparities** among different subpopulations and the factors that contribute to them
- **Supports the community's efforts** to achieve health equity
- Data obtained from a **variety of sources** using various data collection methods

Since 2007, about **15,000** residents have participated in our triennial surveys



All Years - Full Mail Design, Multi-mode

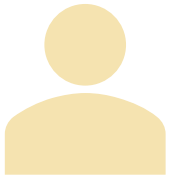

Randomly selected households



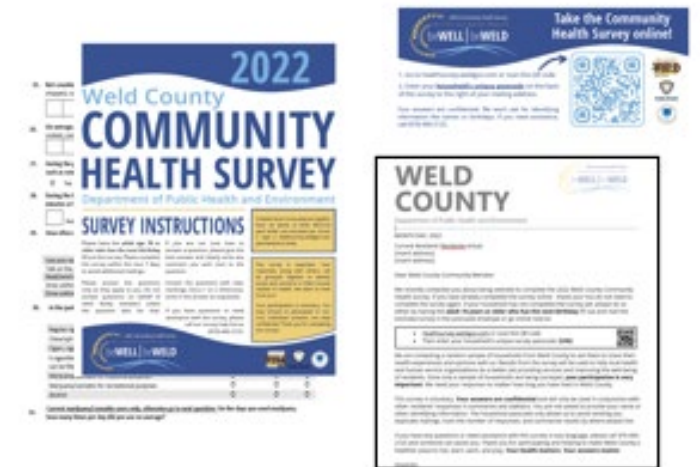
One **adult** (age 18+) per household



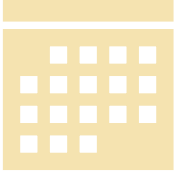
English and **Spanish**

Tailored responsive mail-based design

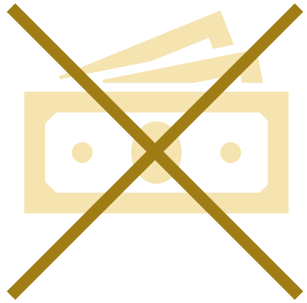


Geographic stratified sampling

No incentives used

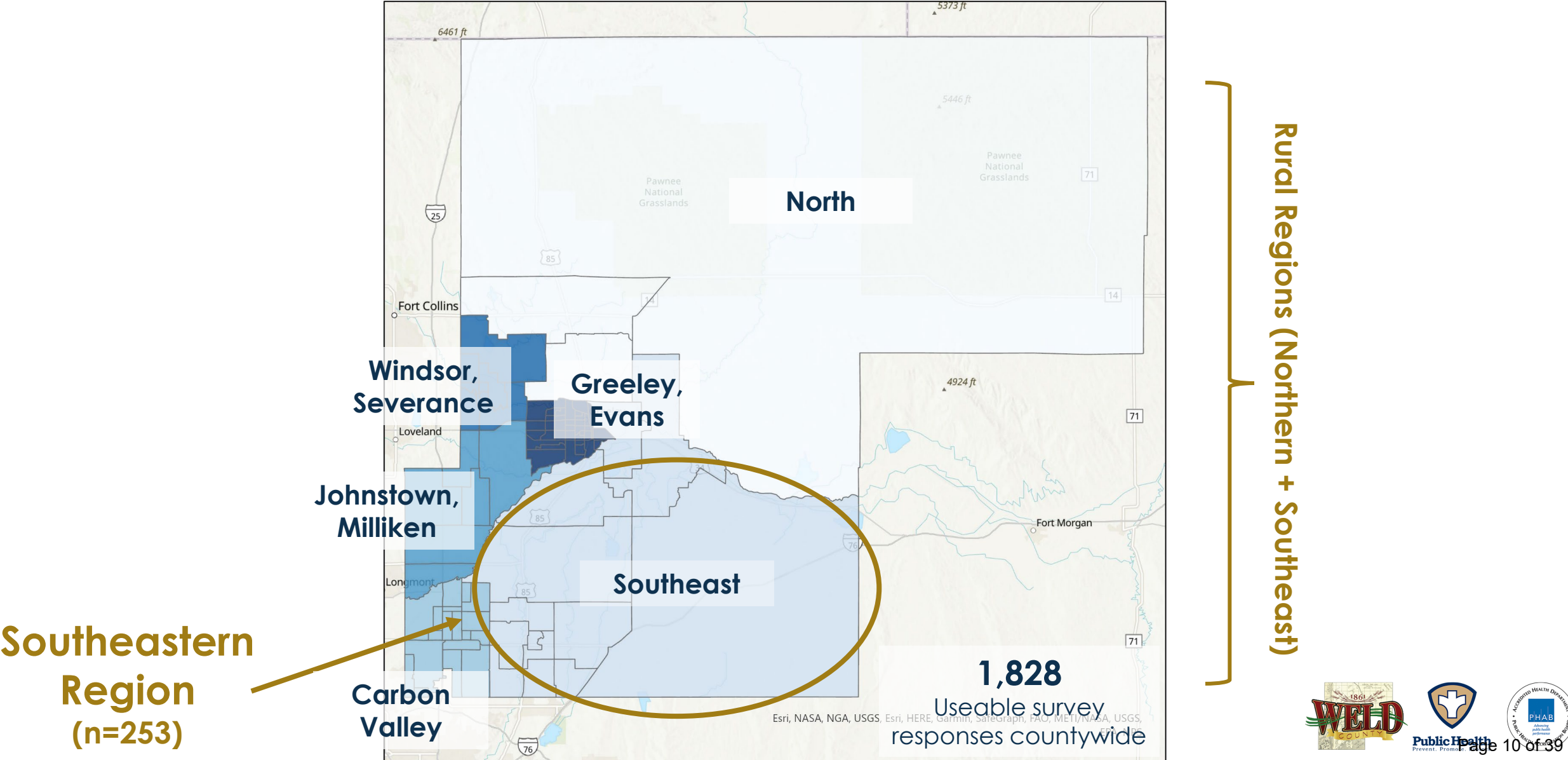


Up to **5** contacts by mail

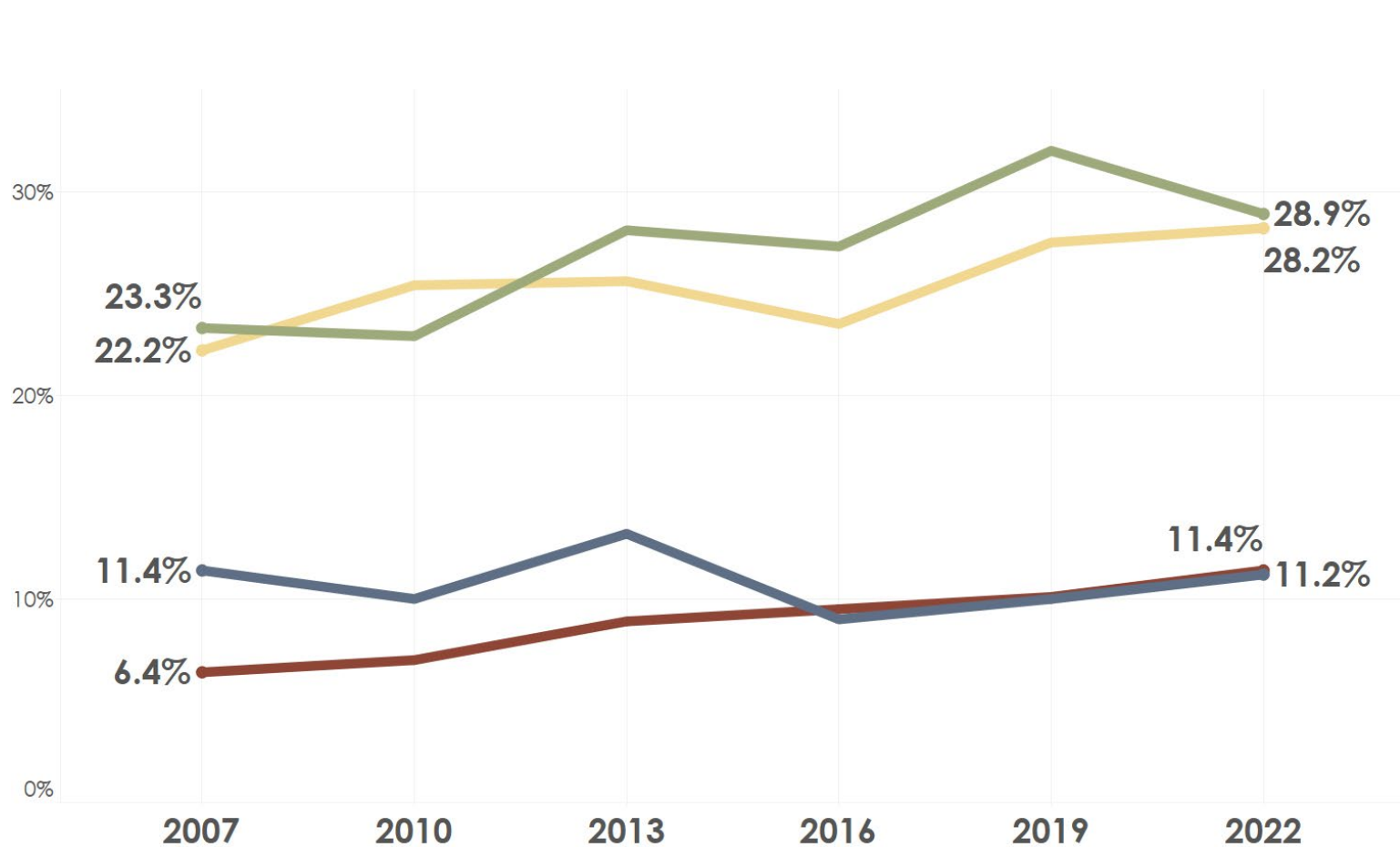

Health Status and Conditions

Chronic Conditions & Self-Rated Health

The prevalence of many chronic conditions has increased



- Asthma
- Diabetes
- High Blood Pressure
- High Cholesterol

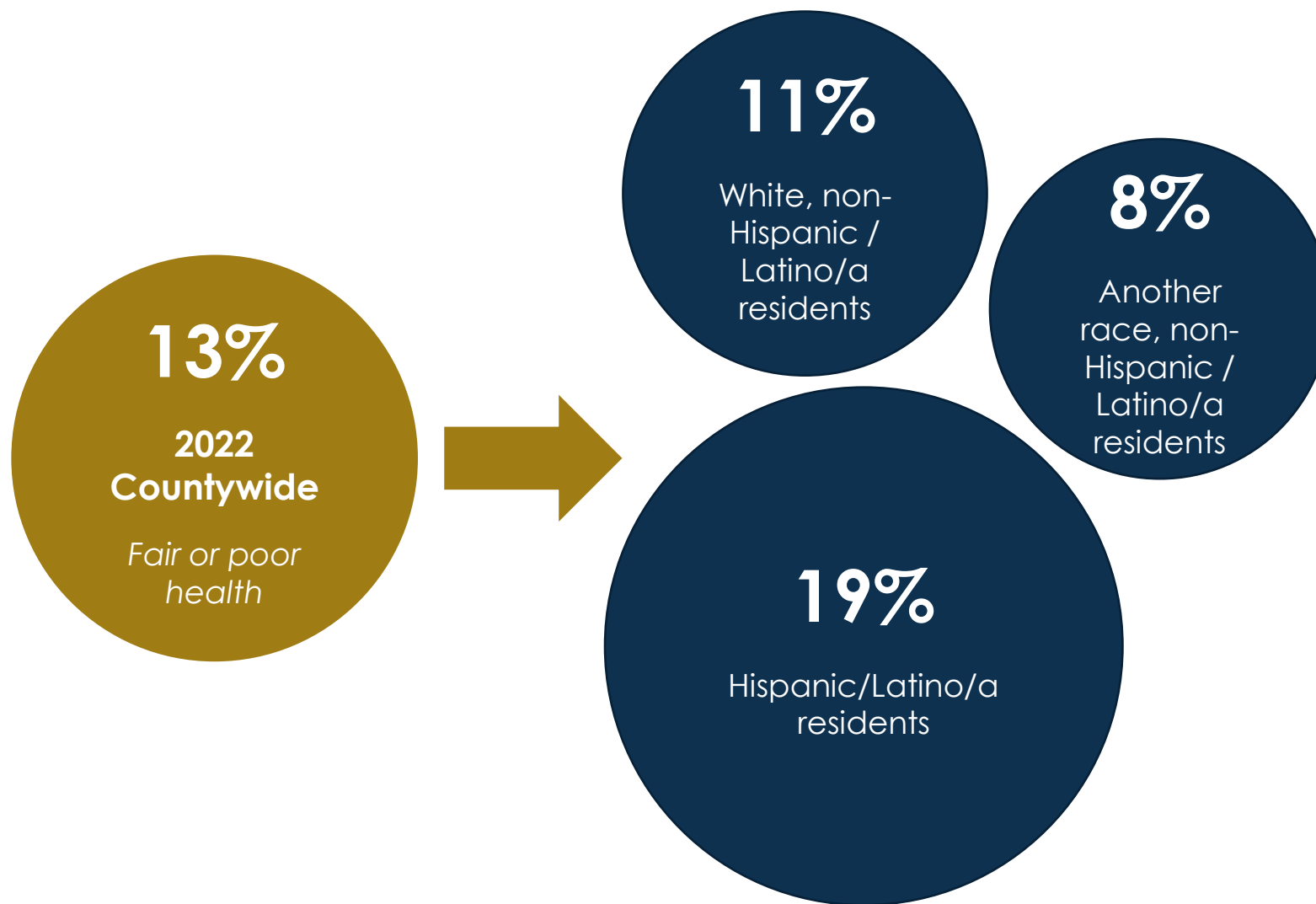
Southeastern Region

33% High Blood Pressure
29% High Cholesterol
17% Asthma
10% Diabetes

*Not significantly different
from other regions*



Self-rated health has worsened, the gap among Hispanic/Latino/a residents has widened



Rural Regions*

14% poor or fair self-rated health

Significantly **worse than I-25 region of the county*

**No significant difference by southeastern region alone*

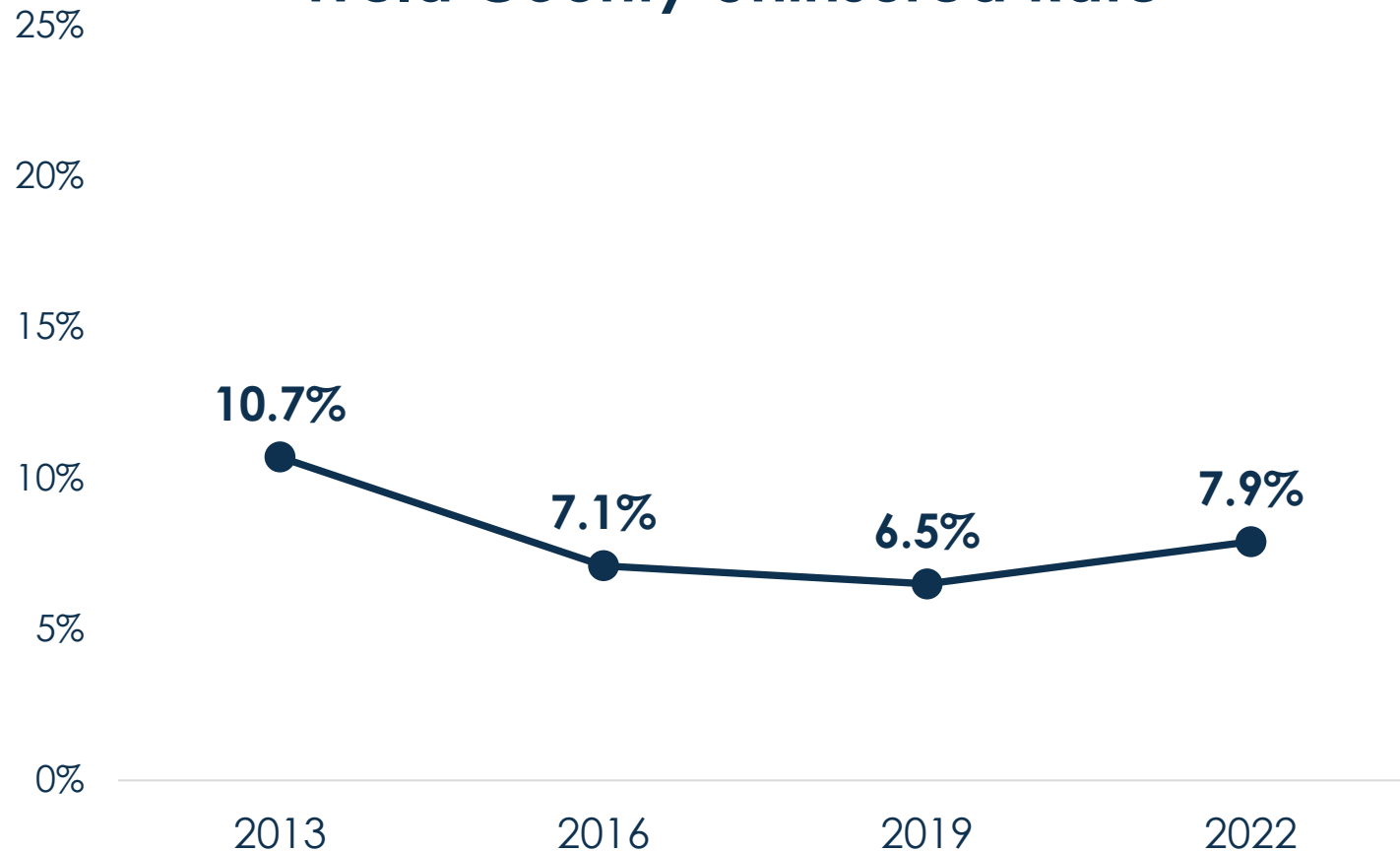


Health Insurance and Use

Health Insurance & Delayed Care

Countywide, 7.9% of adult residents said they did not have health insurance of any kind

Weld County Uninsured Rate



- ↑ 18-34-year-olds (10.7%)
- ↑ Hispanic/Latino/a residents (23.4%)
- ↑ Those with less than a HS diploma/GED (26.7%)

Southeastern Region

11.3% Uninsured

Not significantly different from other regions



Nearly 1 in 3 residents said that they delayed or went without needed health care in the past year

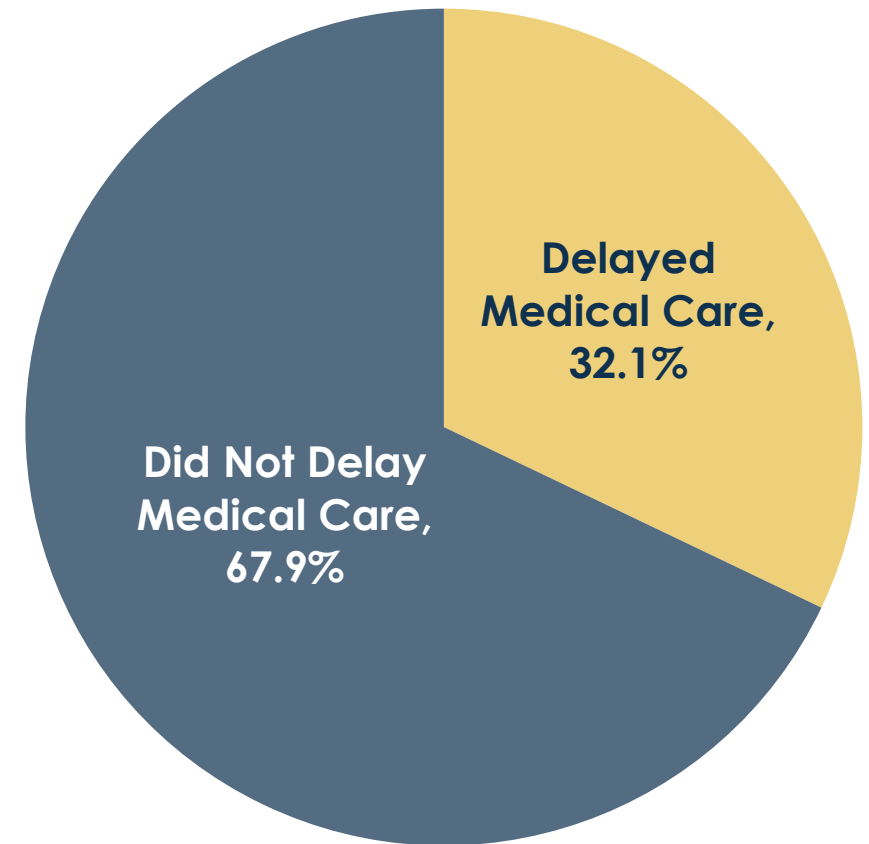
Top reasons for delaying care:

- **Cost** (49.5%)
- **Appointment availability** (36.6%)
- **Time off work** (23.4%)

Southeastern Region

31% delayed or went without needed medical care

Not significantly different from other regions



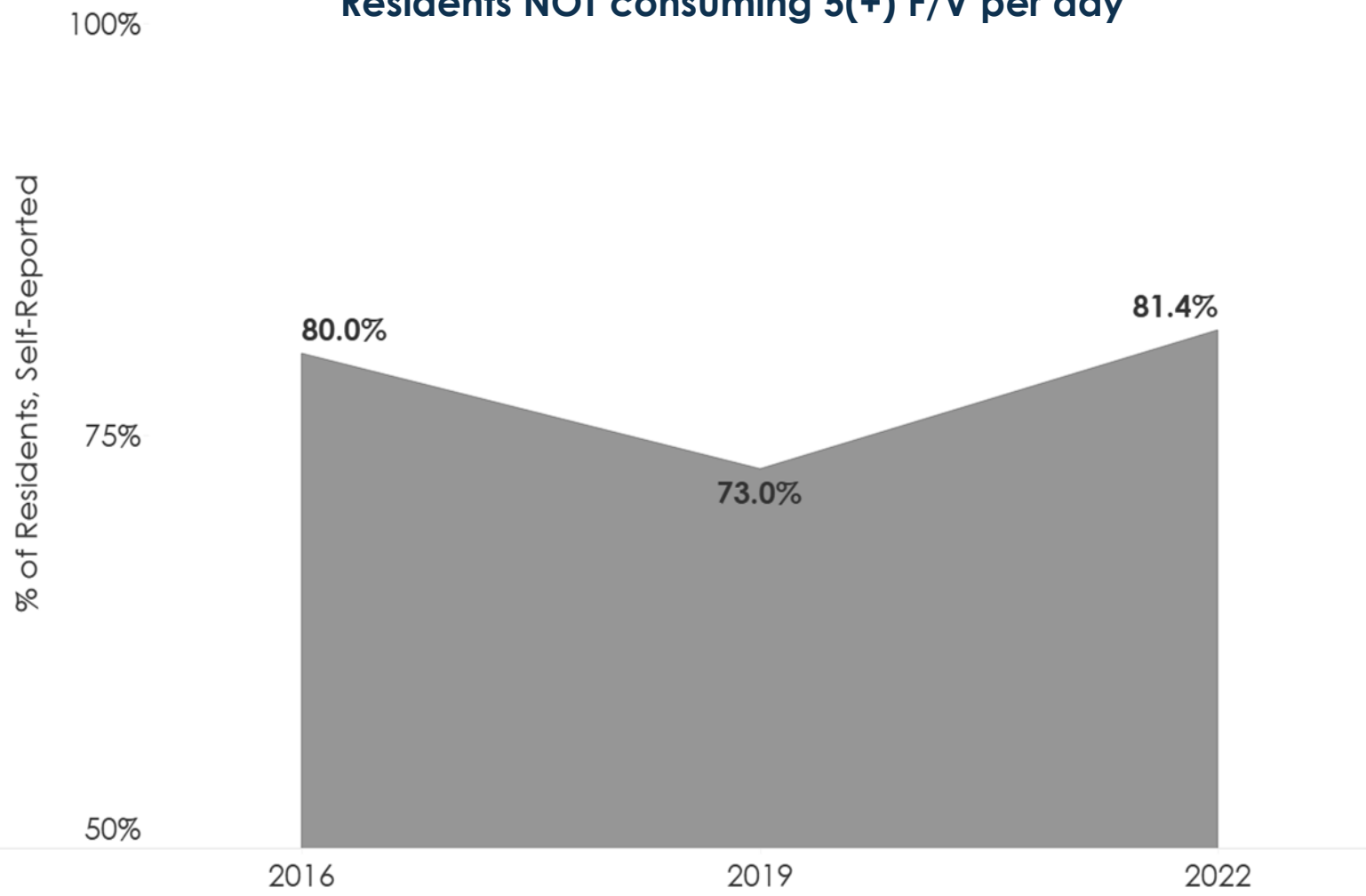


Healthy Lifestyle Behaviors

Fruit/Vegetable Intake & Perception of Walkability

More than 80% of adult residents reported they did NOT eat the recommended number of fruit/vegetable servings per day

Residents NOT consuming 5(+) F/V per day



Southeastern Region*

88% did NOT meet the 5(+) servings for f/v per day

This was significantly **worse than other regions*

Over **1 in 3** residents reported they were concerned that there aren't enough sidewalks or trails to walk or bike in their community (34%)



Southeastern Region*

32% were concerned that there aren't enough sidewalks or trails to walk or bike in their community

This was significantly **worse than Windsor/Severance region*



Social-Emotional Wellbeing

Mental Health Treatment & Resiliency

More residents who reported they needed behavioral health care actually sought treatment

Southeastern Region

65% of those residents
sought treatment

from other regions*

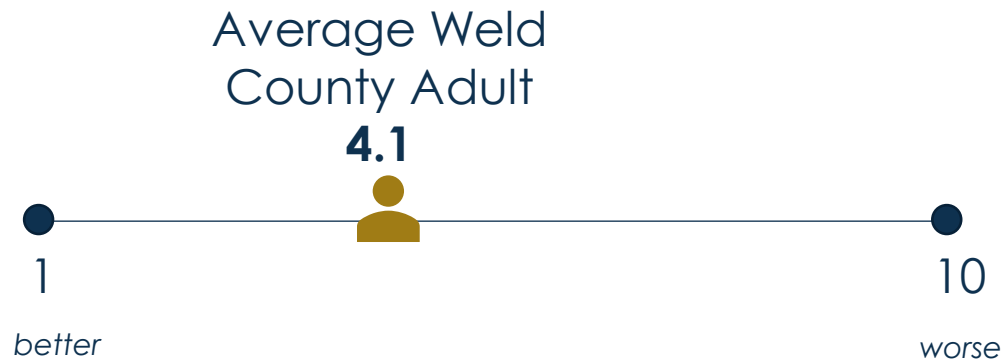

Stress Resistance

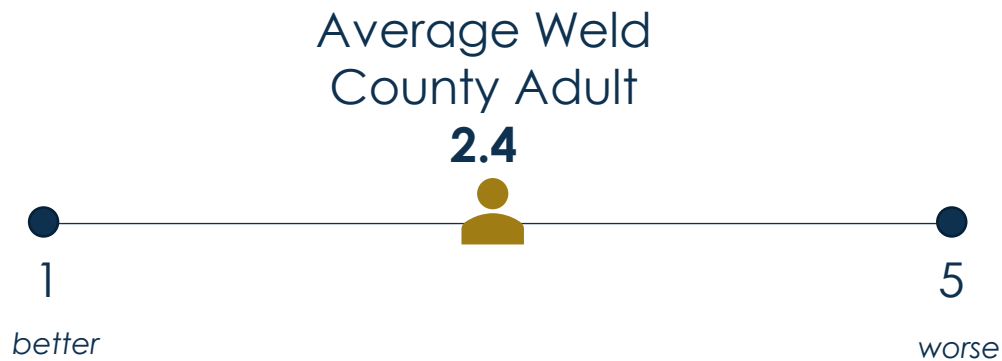


Southeastern Region

Risky Lifestyle Behaviors

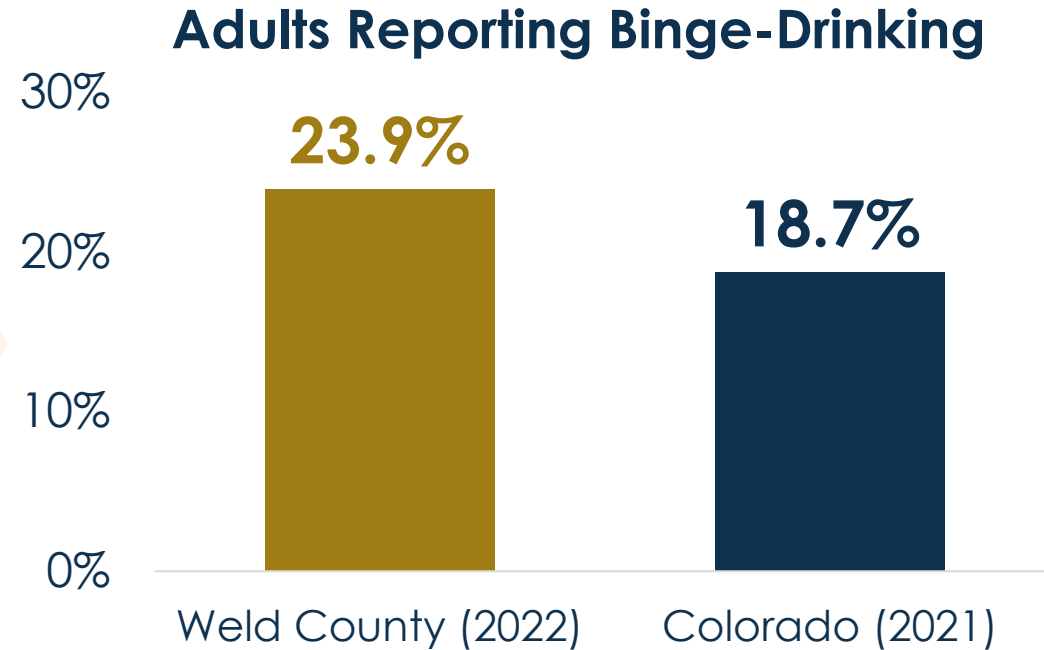
Alcohol & Tobacco Use

Nearly 1 in 4 adults report binge-drinking in the past 30 days, higher than the statewide rate

Southeastern Region
29% reported binge-drinking

Not significantly different from other regions

Binge drinking = 4 or more drinks for a female and 5 or more drinks for a male in one setting



About 14% of adults use some form of tobacco and 8% reported cigarette use

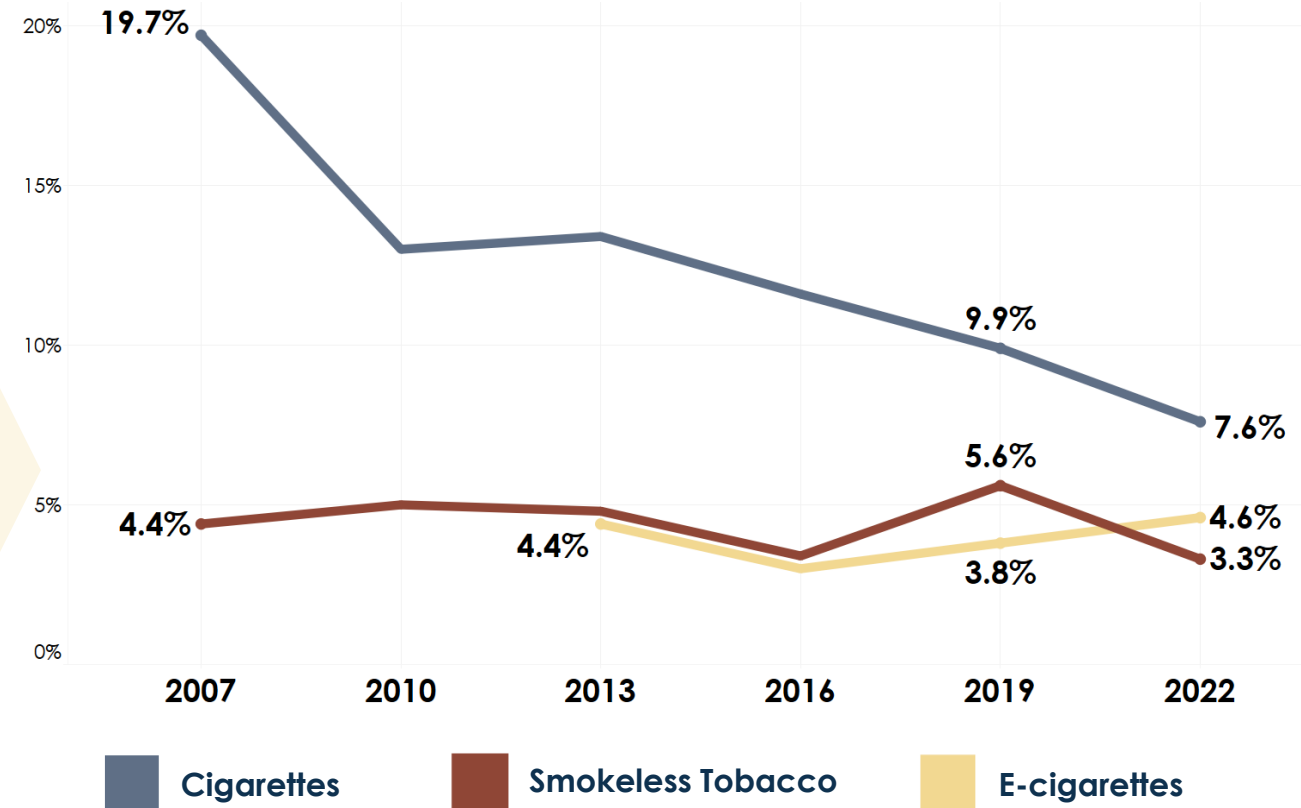
While overall tobacco use has decreased, vaping (e-cigarette) use has increased

Southeastern Region

7.1% reported cigarette use

Not significantly different from other regions

Health and Housing

Housing Instability & Housing Cost Burden



Countywide, nearly 1 in 10 residents (9.5%) reported they may have an unstable housing situation

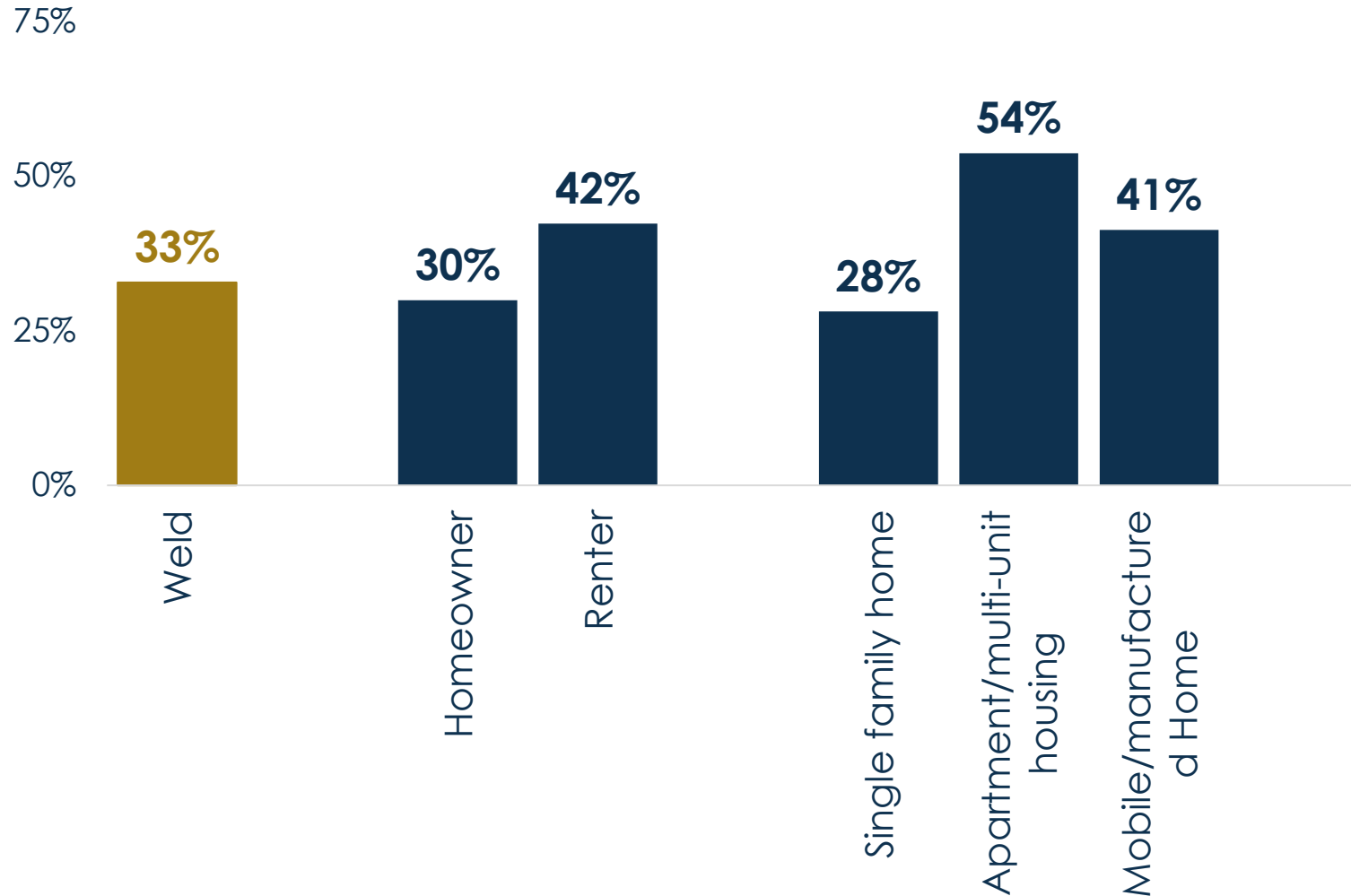
Southeastern Region*

9.6% reported they may have an unstable housing situation

Significantly **worse than other regions in the county, including Northern region (2%) and Windsor/Severance region (4%)*



One-third of residents say they spend more than 30% of their income on mortgage or rent and utility payments



Southeastern Region

29% reported housing cost burden

Not significantly different from other regions

Environmental Health Concerns

Percent Moderately or Very Concerned about various Environmental Health-Related Concerns

	Weld County	Rural Regions
Level of outdoor air quality	62%	56%*
Pollution from oil and gas operations	52%	40%*
Disposal of household hazardous waste in landfills	51%	45%*
Pollution from vehicles	49%	38%*
Pollution from agricultural operations	40%	32%*
Exposure to radon in your home	31%	29%
Potential rabies exposure for you, your family, pets, or livestock	25%	30%**

**Significantly lower percentage of residents worried than other combined survey regions*

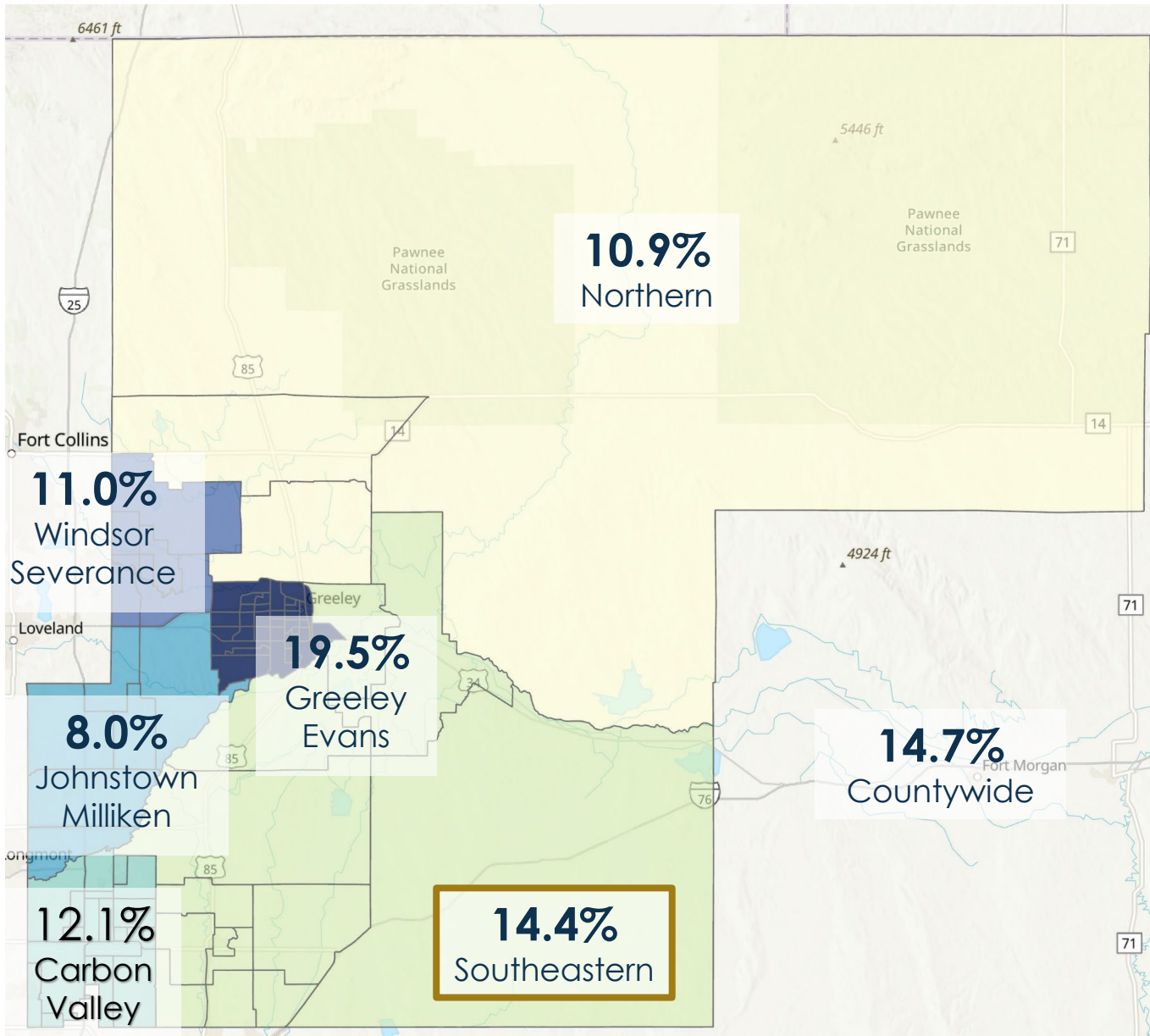
Emergency Preparedness

Need Help in Emergency

"Need help in emergency" = YES to ANY of the following questions:

Survey Questions

- **Medical equipment:** *"Are you dependent on medical equipment that requires electricity to maintain your health?"*
- **Evacuation transportation:** *"In the event of a disaster, would you need transportation provided by another person or service provider to evacuate to a safe location?"*
- **Medical assistance:** *"Do you require another person's assistance to maintain your health due to a chronic medical condition?"*



Needing help in an emergency was highest in rural and Greeley/Evans regions of the county

Needing help in an emergency includes residents who reported they would need help or assistance with evacuation transportation, medical assistance to maintain their health, and/or have medical equipment dependent on electricity
